We at the community center also have our after school program where we do tons of programming and activities with the children. Among working with the after school children with their homework we also have our extended program called "The Force." "The Force" program is a Performing Arts Program where we teach the children dancing, singing, and drama. Also with "The Force" we have our Reading Club, Garden, Club, Culinary Class, and Fitness Club. We also collaborate with Corp in implementing the 3:16 and Girl Guard program every Friday. We also have one our faithful staff that also works during the week with our afterschool children and on Sunday with our Corp Officers and Corp Children. She is such a great addition to our Salvation Army Team.

- A. Which activities are offered to help Increase interaction between The Salvation Army Corps & The Boys and Girls Club / Chartered Community? The activities that we to offer to both programs are the Community Activities, Employee Participation, 3:16, Girl- Guard, Sunbeams, Dance, and Field trips.
- B. State how often the specific program is offered and how many individuals attend on a regular basis.
  These programs are offered by allowing the afterschool children to participate in Sunday activities by showing what they learn through-out each and every week such as dance and activities in 3:16. Offering the employees the opportunity to participate in Sunday Activities with the afterschool and Corp Children and Members. We recently had our family and friends on Sunday where the employees were recognize for their hard work and dedication.
- C. Through providing these activities, how has this increased interaction between The Salvation Army Corps & The Boys and Girls Club / Chartered Community Center? With implementing and introducing these activities has increase membership tremendously over the past year and half. Introducing the new extended arts program really allow more doors to open to many children that may not have ever had the chance to do any of the activities that we serve. With the Corp and Community Center working together really shows the outstanding bond and commitment with the two. Both the Corp and Community center really makes us come together as one body increasing growth and unity throughout the program and which is pouring out into the community.

A. How do the Advisory Board and Advisory Council set program goals that increase interaction between The Salvation Army Corps and The Boys Girls Club / Chartered Community Center?

The Advisory Board and Council are well active when it comes to the interaction with the Corp and Community Center. The advisory board helps with creating the community event such as Fall Festivals, Employee appreciations, Christmas Kettles and Kick-offs, and, making important decisions about funding and

- 4. Involve Corps Youth in Boys & Girls Club / Chartered Community Center Programs
  - A. What Boys & Girls Club / Chartered Community Center Programs are offered to Corps Youth and how many individuals from the Corps participate?

    Dance, 3:16, Girl Guard, and Sunbeam are offered to both. We have a total of 26 children that are enrolled in our after school participation and about 12 Corp Kids.
  - B. What projects have been developed to bring Corps Youth and Boys & Girls Club / Chartered Community Center Members together and what were the results? "The Force" Arts program is our program that we have developed in the past year that has really taken off. It consists of Dancing, Singing, Drama, Creative Art, and 360 Art of Food. The 360 Art of Food is a New Arts programs that basis all its art around food, but also around all the arts. You have The Garden Club where we grow and learn about the growing food. You have the Culinary Club where we teach the kids how to cook no baked items and types of dishes from countries. We have the Art of Food where we draw and paint pictures pertaining to food. We also have done skits, dances, and dramas that are about food, where the children may dress up as fruits and veggies and perform them out. This is a healthy way to introduce a healthy balance and lifestyle of eating.
  - C. How do you get Corps Youth involved in planning activities that they would be interested in participating in at the Boys & Girls Club / Chartered Community Center? Some of the corps boys and girls may also participate in are afterschool and get heavily involved in our community activities and may at some point get involved in our afterschool activities such as visiting the nursing homes, participation in parades, going on Christmas Outings. Also we have our afterschool boys and girls as well as their families to participate in Sunday activities inviting them to the Corp on Sunday's.
  - D. What has been your greatest challenge in getting Corps Youth to participate in Boys & Girls Club / Chartered Community Center programs?

    The greatest challenge I have seen thus far is just rebuilding relationships that may have been lost over the past between former members and having them return back to both the Corp and Community Center.

Our spiritual programs that are offered to the Community center is the 3:16 program which we have every Friday. The Children really enjoy it. We also have our Christian Dance 'The Heirs of Grace", VBS during the summer, our Afterschool Singers where they perform at several nursing homes throughout the year, and Morning Prayer and devotion where we do every day during summer camp before it starts. All of our staff from the Director to the Program Aides takes continuous turns teaching all of these.

The community center is being fed on a weekly basis through the 3:16 on Fridays. We really take great lengths teaching them the ways of the lord and about our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We also have set times during the week outside Friday that we have reading time and teachings on scripture reading and the importance of reading your bible daily. During summer camp we have a Program called Devotion Journey Walk in the Park. The program consists of learning scripture reading praying for our community and families. We also teach only Christian Base music to our dance department teaching them the importance of giving God Ultimate praise through waving our hands singing Hallelujah which we all know is the highest Praise. We also have An Evangelist group that comes and spiritual fed our children during Summer Camp teaching bible stories and scripture reading.
